## WHAT GOES IN MY BLUE BIN?

#### **PLASTICS**

Symbol 1 - 7 (usually found on the bottom of container) such as:



**HOUSEHOLD PLASTICS MUST BE CLEAN AND DRY, AND HAVE A SYMBOL** 

- ✓ Berry containers (clamshells)
- ✓ Bulk lettuce containers
- ✓ Clear plastic takeout drink cups (eq. iced caps)
- ✓ Condiment bottles
- ✓ Cracker and cookie trays
- ✓ Large yogurt tubs
- ✓ Laundry jugs
- ✓ Margarine tubs & lids

#### NO PLASTIC BAGS OR WRAP. **EVEN IF NUMBERED**

- ✓ Plastic lids (with a symbol) & larger than the size of your palm
- ✓ Plastic milk jugs
- ✓ Plastic pails
- ✓ Salad dressing bottles
- ✓ Shampoo/Conditioner bottles
- ✓ Tupperware containers (if clean)
- ✓ Vitamin/pill bottles
- ✓ Water and juice bottles (if not returning for refund)

### FOOD & BEVERAGE / Buttermilk **CARTONS**

- Caps can be left on \*if not returning for refund where applicable
- ✓ Chocolate/White Milk
- ✓ Coffee Cream
- ✓ Eggnog\*
- ✓ Juice\*

- ✓ Plant-based beverages\* (soy, almond, oat, etc.)
- ✓ Soup & Broth cartons
- ✓ Water\* (eg. coconut water)

#### **PAPER**

- ✓ Books (hard covers must be removed)
- ✓ Envelopes (plain or window)
- ✓ Flyers (NO bags)
- ✓ Greeting cards (plain)
- ✓ Loose paper

- ✓ Magazines
- ✓ Newspapers
- ✓ Phone books
- ✓ Shredded paper (put in a clear bag, tie and place in bin)



#### **METAL**

EXTRA! EXTRA!

- ✓ Aluminum cooking pans, plates & tin foil
- ✓ Beverage cans (if not returning for refund)
- ✓ Cans (juice, pet food, vegetable, fruits, soup, meats)
- ✓ Canning lids & rings
- ✓ Metal lids

Remove labels if you can. Sharp-edged lids should be left attached or secured inside the can.



#### **CARDBOARD**

- Cereal
- ✓ Cereal boxes
- ✓ Cracker boxes
- ✓ Corrugated boxes
- ✓ Drink trays
- ✓ Egg cartons
- ✓ Other food boxes
- ✓ Paper towel & toilet paper rolls
- ✓ Shoe boxes
- Tissue boxes



ALL ITEMS CLEAN & DRY. **PLACE LOOSE IN BIN** (DON'T NEST UNLESS **SIMILAR ITEMS; EG. CANS IN CANS)** 



# IN THE BLUE BIN

- NOT ACCEPTED 

  X Foam egg cartons, trays or take out containers (even if numbered)
  - Frying pans or baking sheets
  - X Garbage
  - Glass of any kind
  - X Lottery tickets
  - X Paper towel & tissues
  - X Pellet bags and feed bags
  - X Photographs
  - X Plastic shopping/bread bags
  - X Plastics without a number

- X Plastics wrap or sandwich bags
- X Playing cards
- X Potato bags, chip, flour or sugar bags
- x Soiled or wet items of any kind
- X Store receipts
- X Straws
- X Styrofoam/polystyrene packaging
- X Tissue paper
- X Vinyl Siding/Construction Materials
- X Wrapping paper

Fireworks

X Ammunition

X Disposable cups

X Film plastics

X Batteries

X Binders
