NANB Centennial Year- Proclamation - 1916-2016

- Whereas the New Brunswick Association of Graduate Nurses (NBAGN) became the first nursing regulatory organization created in 1916, to later be renamed the Nurses Association of New Brunswick (NANB) in 1984, regulating today over 8,900 registered nurse and nurse practitioner members, the largest group of health professionals in the province;
- Whereas the Nurses Association of New Brunswick maintains a collaborative working relationship with all levels of government, other nursing organizations, health professionals and health service providers establishing and supporting programs to continually improve the health system and overall population health;
- Whereas the Nurses Association of New Brunswick continues to advocate for public policies and programs that are informed by the social determinants of health including investments in education, housing and the environment, while supporting healthy public policy initiatives;
- Whereas nurse professionals are a trusted and essential component of our health system, active and engaged in our communities and that nurses are also at our bedsides in our homes and in our schools, educate future generations of nurses, lead research and international development initiatives, play a key role in Canada's military, are catalysts to improving access to health services;
- Therefore, I, Arthur Slipp Mayor of the Town of Woodstock, do hereby proclaim 2016 as the Centennial year for the Nurses Association of New Brunswick: one hundred years of continued excellence in nursing, and urge all residents of the Town of Woodstock to join in observance and recognition of registered nurses and nurse practitioners for their dedication and commitment to the health of New Brunswickers.
