With COVID, I would like to publicly thank the Mayor, Members of Council and the Employees of the Town of Woodstock for their unwavering dedication to the delivery of municipal services, during these not so normal times.

The management team has had a few changes, Mr. Andrew Garnett, is now the Director of Development and Planning, with Mr. Greg Stokes promoted from the superintendent of public works to the Director of Public Works and Utility. Mrs. Tobi Pirie's role as the Tourism & Event Coordinator is now the Director of Tourism, Events and Communication. Assistant Clerk and Payroll, Mrs. Fallon Lappage, is now Director of Human Resources and Payroll Services. With the retirement of Mr. Andrew Bird, Mr. Harold Boomer has returned to work with the town in the capacity of Utility Operator, and we would like to welcome Harold back, knowing his skill set will be a great addition to our team.

I'm pleased to inform our residents that the Well Project and the AYR Motor Centre Retrofit Project will be cluing up in late June and August respectively. Through a funding partnership, from the Federal and Provincial Governments, the Municipality, and our residents will have the benefit of a second secure water source, and a recreation complex that is second to none in our province. Please stay tuned for an official announcement on the opening of these town operations.

In staying with funding, the town has applied for funding through the Regional Development Corporation, (RDC) to upgrade the Town Square. The town has confirmed their financial commitment to the project, so now we're waiting on approval from the Provincial and Federal Governments. With Downtown, we will be promoting the sale of Town Owned Vacant Land (s). As a municipality, we are very much looking forward to working with developers, as we strive to address the lack of accommodations as per the Housing Assessment Strategy and the mandate, as per our Municipal Plan; 2020-2030.

Public Works & Utility

In the early summer weeks, the Public Works Department generally has a number of jobs to conduct, one that includes line painting of cross walks and parking lots. To ensure the safety of the crew you should expect to see flaggers or detours to help with this work. Please drive safe and slowly while in these areas.

Extra Garbage Pickup

The Town of Woodstock is pleased to offer an extra garbage pickup, during your recycling week, for the months of June, July & August. The garbage truck will follow the recycling truck so make sure you place both your garbage and your blue bin at the street on the morning of your regular pickup (Tuesday or Wednesday).

Did you know:

The Water & Sewer By-Law states that all sewer connections are to have the appropriate apparatus, such as check valves and back flow devices to prevent the flow of any substance from the service connection pipes to enter the building or structure.

Development & Planning

We are excited to let you know that very soon the Development and Planning Department will be introducing new forms to better serve you. These forms are more user friendly and will provide a consistent method of providing services for you when applying for building permits to inquiring about rezoning. Woodstock Volunteer Fire Department

What am I allowed to have for a firepits/places within Town of Woodstock Limits? According to By-Law 81-2 General and Penalty Provisions Section 22 is amended to read as follows:

- 22.1 No person shall set on fire any combustible material within the town, nor kindle a fire, nor cause or authorize a fire to be kindled in or upon any street, road, square, lane or highway within the town excepting as provided in section 22.2.
- 22.2 The supervised use of the following appliances/devices does not contravene section
- 22.1; propane/charcoal barbecues; structurally sound outdoor screened fireplaces of either metal, concrete or brick construction. Outdoor campground fires in an approved and supervised campground area require permission of the campground operator and must be attended by campsite occupier.

Just a reminder and no garbage or debris just clean dry wood when the provincial forest fire index allows. The Forest Fire index is updated daily at website: www2.gnb.ca/content/gnb/en/news/public_alerts/forest_fire_watch.html

Woodstock Recreation & Community Services

Staffing:

- Summer Students -12 summer students have been hired to support summer programming and operations.
- Resignation-One of our full-time aquatic staff members, Elizabeth Mayzik (nee Williamson) has left us and is moving to
 Ontario to pursue new job prospects. We hired Elizabeth as a part-time student in 2011. She left to pursue secondary
 education and has since started a family. Liz came on as a full-time aquatic staff in the fall of 2017. We are happy for
 Elizabeth, her husband Jordan and young son, Calvin that they are continuing their life adventure but it leaves a large
 void in our aquatic team. Liz is a very valuable member of our staff, is great with kids and people in general. She has
 taught many the life skills of swimming and has trained many lifeguards over the last few years. Not to mention has
 trained many area youth to be good babysitters.

Summer Events:

- Senior Socials- Senior Socials will be held monthly, Jack MacPhee will providing live entertainment on June 30
- Kids of Steel Triathlon has been scheduled for July 24
- Get Muddy has been scheduled for August 21

Summer Programs:

• Couch to 5k – We currently have 22 registered for the C25k training program. Coaches, Meg and Krista, have returned to help us offer a program that progressively follows a run/walk program with the goal of running 5k at the end of 10-weeks.

- After School Junior Golf- we have partnered with the Woodstock Golf & Curling Club to offer an afterschool program. This
 is for youth that have golf experience but require supervision to go around the course. One of our summer students and
 one of the club's volunteers will each take a group out to play the course. We are looking to organize this program for
 summer as well.
- Swim Lessons- Summer swimming lessons begin July 11th and run for 8 weeks.
- Swim Team July 13-Aug 26
- Youth Tennis- June 29-July 27
- Day Camp- we will be offering full week day camps with lots of activities and field trips planned
- Basketball Skills and Drills- our summer student Bree Hallett will be offering something new to youth ages 8 to 11yrs.
- Youth Fun Box Youth ages 7-10, July 5-Aug 9
- Competitive Boxing we are very excited to have some new coaches and leadership established and will be launching
 our new competitive boxing training classes, beginning this Friday. A grant was submitted to purchase new equipment.
 We are in the process of partnering with Woodstock First Nation for use of some new equipment and to run a youth
 program with them.

Facilities:

- Indoor pool will be closed June 28-July 10 to install piping for new HVAC unit in September
- The new Ice Plant is in the process of being installed.
- Tennis and Pickleball Courts-The condition of the McKinley tennis courts are being reviewed and upgrade considerations are ongoing
