

**By-Law No. 132**  
**A By-Law Relating to Loitering, Begging, and Soliciting**

The council of the Town of Woodstock, under authority vested in it by Section 91 of the Municipalities Act, being Chapter M-22 of the revised statutes of New Brunswick, enacts as follows:

Title

This By-Law may be cited as a By-Law relating to loitering, begging, and soliciting.

1. Section 911.1 of the Municipalities Act is hereby adopted as being in force in the Town of Woodstock

91.1(1) No person shall loiter unless such person, when required to do so, justifies his reason for doing so.

91.1(2) no person shall beg or solicit from door to door or in a public place except as may be authorized by the municipality.

91.1 (3) every person who commits an -offence under this section is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty dollars and in default of payment is liable to imprisonment in accordance with subsection 31(3) of the summary convictions act. 1977, c.35, s.3.
