Economic Development Committee – April 1st, 2019

CAO Pinsent summarized the highlights of the report of the Economic Development Committee:

<u>Submission of proposals for Charles Street property</u> – The committee decided to table this for now given the lack of any urgency and the lack of a more wholesome plan for that area.

<u>Comms and Marketing presentation</u> – Brittney Toner presented her work to date and the upcoming work in the next three months.

<u>Business proposal for 698 Main Street</u> – Shaun Albright presented his plan to the committee. There is a shortage of parking according to the current bylaws. The ToW is in the process of verifying with the Baptist Church whether the Town could lease a portion of their parking on the North side of the church to facilitate the parking requirements for this business.

<u>Housing Availability summary</u> – A summary of housing was provided to the ToW from the realestate board, but as it was grouped with the City of Fredericton, it is not much use for planning purposes.

<u>Planning Meeting with Dillon</u> – The CAO met with Dillon to discuss the feasibility of contracting for planning services. Dillon has a registered planner on staff who would be able to support the ToW in its planning requirements. Dillon will present a proposal for those planning services, which could include a Municipal plan update (meeting provincial requirements). Dillon will also provide a dedicated briefing to council on planning services and how they are used in a municipal context. This is a common presentation they provide to municipalities.

<u>Economic Development Workplan (previously distributed)</u> – This item was tabled until such time as Councillor Bradbury could provide input.

Protective Services Committee - April 3rd, 2019

CAO Pinsent summarized the highlights of the report of the Protective Services Committee:

Animal Control By-Law – The Animal control bylaw was presented for discussion. The discussion revolved around the issue of enforcement and the differentiation between legal enforcement and Administrative and Monetary Penalties (AMP). It was agreed that the language of administrative penalties should be included in the bylaw, but it would take the remainder of 2019 to get that process in place. Enforcement would begin when penalties are in place (2020). It was also suggested and agreed to that once this bylaw was enacted, that the ToW start a communication campaign with a series of FAQ's to help educate the community with regards to the future implications of the new bylaw.

<u>Appointment of Volunteer Firefighters / Remuneration By-Law</u> – The Fire By-Law was presented for discussion and was approved in principle. This bylaw deals with the appointment of Volunteers, the Fire Department Officers and the Fire Chief. The Bylaw also specifies the remuneration of the officers within the Fire Department.

Finance Committee – April 8th, 2019

CAO Pinsent summarized the highlights of the report of the Finance Committee:

<u>Payment of Holdback to Hatchard Engineering for the AMC Build project</u> - The committee recommended that the \$20K holdback be approved for payment. All of the deficiencies (the window leaks being the most significant) have been satisfactorily dealt with by the firm. Given there was no budget amount for this payment, it was recommended that the payment be made from Capital reserves. A motion for this transaction to be made at the next council meeting.

Recycling Bin Payments – The RSC submitted an invoice for \$43,000 to pay for the blue recycling bins. The amount paid in 2018 (as part of the tipping fees) was \$32,000. It was recommended and supported by the committee that the ToW pay \$32,000 this year and the remainder to be paid in 2020. Furthermore, it was recommended that an annual amount be budgeted for Blue Bins for the provision of bins to people who need them in the future. This is a process that staff will work through for FY 2020.

Gas Tax Projects – The gas tax projects were recommended for approval as presented.

Interest removal from property owner's account – A resident was asking for the removal of interest from their Water and Sewer account as a result of the Town office being closed on the 31st of March. It is recommended that no interest be removed as a result of the office closure as the resident had ample time to pay their bill electronically or in person. It should be noted that staff will, in the future, ensure that the last date for payment NOT to fall on a day when the office is closed.
