

Town of Woodstock Policing Expansion Review FEEDBACK WANTED - Please Read & Participate



WHY IS THE TOWN REVIEWING THEIR POLICING MODEL?

After Local Governance reform, the Province asked the Woodstock Police Force in January of 2023 to provide a plan to expand policing to the new boundaries. Early in 2024 the plan was approved. As significant transitional funding was offered by the province to support a transition for the WPF to take over the new boundaries, an extensive review of the plan was completed in May and June to develop a workable financial and operational plan to support the proposed policing model. Surveys and public forums provide an opportunity for public to provide feedback before a final decision is made by Council early September.

WHAT IS IT GOING TO COST?

PRELIMINARY 2025-2027 ESTIMATED BUDGETS

Current 2024 WPF & RCMP Budget - \$ 5.3 million Estimated 2025 WPF & RCMP Budget - \$ 7.1 million Estimated 2026 WPF & RCMP Budget - \$ 8.3 million <u>Estimated 2027 WPF Budget - \$ 8.7 million</u>

*Additional Estimated Capital Costs - \$ 1.8 million

Proposed Property Tax Increases for Policing - 2025, 2026, 2027

Ward 4 - No increase Wards 1, 2, 3, & 5 - <u>5 cents per year</u>

Outside Wards municipal portion of property taxes proposed increase from \$ 0.70 today to \$ 0.85 by 2027


PROPERTY TAX EXAMPLE - On a home assessed at \$200,000 - a 5 cent increase = \$100 additional per year

Why does the added cost have to come from property taxes? Today, 85% of all municipal costs are covered by property taxes, including policing costs. We hope Provincial Fiscal Reform for municipalities, that is supposed to happen by 2026, will provide us another revenue stream that will help us better manage costs and taxes.

Did you know the former town boundaries were equivalent to 15 square kilometers? The **new expanded boundary is 532 square kilometers! 35 times the original size!**

WHAT WILL MY SERVICE LOOK LIKE?

The proposed model is a 24/7 policing model for everyone that aims to prioritize regular police visibility and address community safety concerns through defined and publicly communicated strategic planning.
