WHAT GOES IN MY BLUE BIN?

PLASTICS

Symbol 1 - 7 (usually found on the bottom of container) such as:



HOUSEHOLD PLASTICS MUST BE CLEAN AND DRY, AND HAVE A SYMBOL

NO PLASTIC BAGS OR WRAP, EVEN IF NUMBERED



- ✓ Berry containers (clamshells)
- ✓ Bulk lettuce containers
- ✓ Clear plastic takeout drink cups (eg. iced caps)
- ✓ Condiment bottles
- ✓ Cracker and cookie trays
- ✓ Large yogurt tubs
- ✓ Laundry jugs
- ✓ Margarine tubs & lids

- ✓ Plastic lids (with a symbol) & larger than the size of your palm
- ✓ Plastic milk jugs
- ✓ Plastic pails
- ✓ Salad dressing bottles
- ✓ Shampoo/Conditioner bottles
- ✓ Tupperware containers (if clean)
- ✓ Vitamin/pill bottles
- ✓ Water and juice bottles (if not returning for refund)

FOOD & BEVERAGE CARTONS

- ✓ Buttermilk
- ✓ Chocolate/White Milk
- ✓ Coffee Cream
- ✓ Eggnog*
- ✓ Juice*

- ✓ Plant-based beverages* (soy, almond, oat, etc.)
- ✓ Soup & Broth cartons
- ✓ Water* (eg. coconut water)



Caps can be left on
*if not returning for refund where applicable

PAPER

- ✓ Books (hard covers must be removed)
- ✓ Envelopes (plain or window)
- ✓ Flyers (NO bags)
- ✓ Greeting cards (plain)
- ✓ Loose paper

- ✓ Magazines
- ✓ Newspapers
- ✓ Phone books
- ✓ Shredded paper (put in a clear bag, tie and place in bin)



METAL

- ✓ Aluminum cooking pans, plates & tin foil
- ✓ Beverage cans (if not returning for refund)
- ✓ Cans (juice, pet food, vegetable, fruits, soup, meats)

- ✓ Canning lids & rings
- ✓ Metal lids

Remove labels if you can. Sharp-edged lids should be left attached or secured inside the can.



CARDBOARD

- ✓ Cereal boxes
- ✓ Cracker boxes
- ✓ Corrugated boxes
- ✓ Drink trays
- ✓ Egg cartons
- ✓ Other food boxes
- ✓ Paper towel & toilet paper rolls
- ✓ Shoe boxes
- ✓ Tissue boxes



ALL ITEMS CLEAN & DRY. PLACE LOOSE IN BIN (DON'T NEST UNLESS SIMILAR ITEMS; EG. CANS IN CANS)

NOT ACCEPTED IN THE BLUE BIN

- ✗ Ammunition
- ✗ Batteries
- ✗ Binders
- ✗ Coat hangers (plastic or wire)
- ✗ Disposable cups
- ✗ Film plastics (eg: wrap around paper towel) (Redemption Centre)
- ✗ Fireworks
- ✗ Foam egg cartons, trays or take out containers (even if numbered) (Redemption Centre)
- ✗ Frying pans or baking sheets
- ✗ Garbage
- ✗ Glass of any kind (Redemption Centre)
- ✗ Lottery tickets
- ✗ Paper towel & tissues
- ✗ Pellet bags and feed bags
- ✗ Photographs
- ✗ Plastic shopping/bread bags (Redemption Centre)
- ✗ Plastics without a number
- ✗ Plastics wrap or sandwich bags (Redemption Centre)
- ✗ Playing cards
- ✗ Potato bags, chip, flour or sugar bags (Redemption Centre)
- ✗ Soiled or wet items of any kind
- ✗ Store receipts
- ✗ Straws
- ✗ Styrofoam/polystyrene packaging (Redemption Centre)
- ✗ Tissue paper
- ✗ Vinyl Siding/Construction Materials
- ✗ Wrapping paper
